

### **Jack “Veritas” Fields:**

Jack is the son of the 1970s hero Veritas (Abbey Fields), and her husband Lt. William Fields. Growing up in Long Island was not a hard life and he had his friend Sean Alvarado, with whom he has kept in touch with his entire life. Not the best or brightest student, Jack excelled in memorization of facts and subjects that interested him the most, mainly the stories of super heroes and super villains from before his time.

Jack’s motivation to become a Citizen Defender is partially there due to his strong bond with his mother and deep respect for her. Taking her name as his C.D. codename, he hopes to be a hero to help as many as possible, as long as possible. The other factor was wanting to live out his own stories like those he heard when he was a kid. Obviously he wants to help people, but he struggles with what that actually *means* in the Citizen Defender Initiative.

#### Physical description:

Jack is a tall, broad-shouldered young man. He’s got the physique of an MMA fighter, as that is his preferred style of combat. Muay Thai and Jiu Jitsu are his two major forms to use. Not ripped and chiseled, but athletically fit and muscular. No rippling biceps or crazy 12-pack abs like Cyclops or Wolverine. An athlete, with muscle. Good body reference for him would maybe be Ryan Bader from the UFC. For his face, think Jared Padelecki from Supernatural. Boyish, but still handsome.

#### Powers:

Jack’s powers are somewhat devolved versions of his mother’s powers. Super strength, a level of durability beyond that of a normal human, and flight up to 70 miles per hour.

Jack can lift a full dumpster over his head and throw it, maybe even a large industrial pickup truck like a Ford F150, but anything beyond that like a cement truck or steam roller he’s unable to lift. If anything, he’d be able to push a fully-loaded semi-truck a few miles before becoming completely exhausted.

His durability is still a somewhat unknown quantity. While in training he was hit with bats, and blunt objects, he was never actually hit with a knife, or other bladed weapon, or an actual firearm. Writer and artist knowledge though is that a low caliber bullet will not hurt him. The highest caliber of round that will not penetrate his skin but nick him REALLY badly would be a .45.

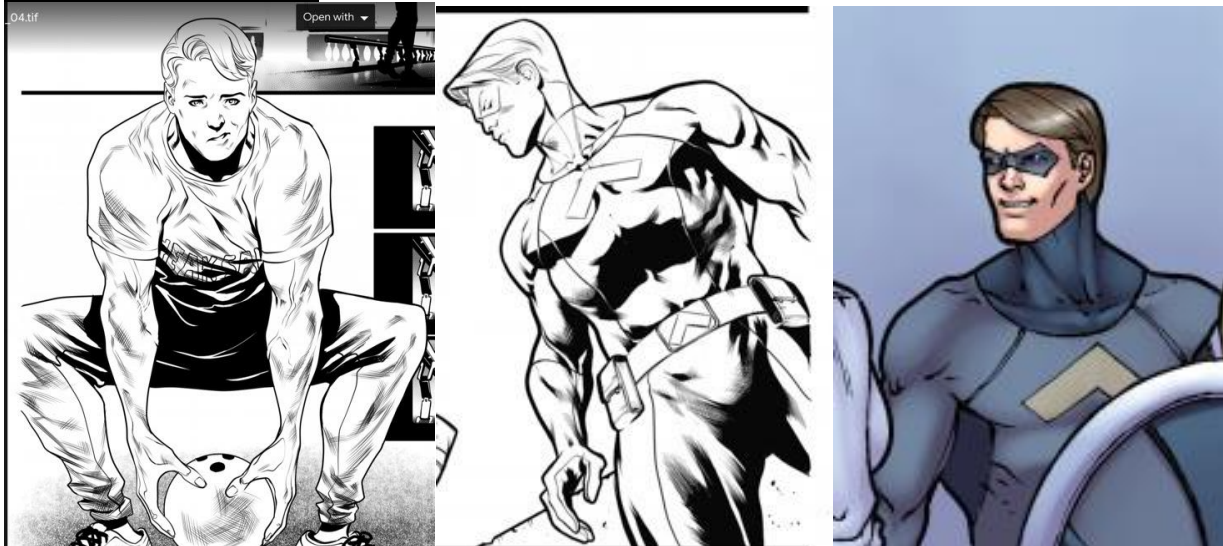
#### Style:

## MOTIVES AND FEARS:

Jack is afraid of being labeled as a one-trick-pony. He's a Strongman type so he thinks that's all people will see him as. He wants to help people, so he's going to throw himself into learning all

aspects of the business to be the best Superhero he can be. Unfortunately he doesn't know what that means. He's clever, but not as smart as other people. He takes to the super hero gig naturally, but thinking about what he can do other than punch things is a struggle.

In spite of his fears, he's going to throw himself in front of danger and threats *like* a bullet sponge, because that's his knee-jerk reaction. Ironically, he naturally does the thing he's afraid of people making him do. He can tell that because of his power set, people are going to use him as a threat of violence, rather than a protector who can do more.
